Pax Dove

We will be creating a 3-dimensional Dove out of paper. This dove can be disassembled for mailing and easily re-assembled. No glue, no tape.

In my Latin Dictionary: Pax, means Peace; Grace; Serenity; Enough! The Dove, as we know, has a lot of symbolism attached to it: Biblically, it represents the Holy Spirit. Also, peace, grace, love, renewal, purity, hope and so much more.

As we wrap up an AMAZNG year of tangling, Mom and I thought this project would be fun and apropos on a number of levels.

I talked with CZT Cheryl Moote, who created this, and told her I wanted to teach this as a class. I asked for her permission, which she gave, and also asked how she would recommend I get the booklets. Some instructions:

The paper you want to use should be bendable. Regular copy paper may be too thin. I did the sample on it and it was ok. Something a little thicker would be better. Cheryl recommends card stock or 90 lb watercolor paper.

If your printer handles cardstock, you can print right on it, OR print out the template on regular paper, cut it out, and then use it to trace on the paper you wish to use.

There are 4 templates, 3 of them are in half. Place the template on a folded piece of paper, lining up the fold line on the template with the fold in the paper and trace/cut. There are three places where the paper will be connected as you can see. The last template is laid out already. Cut it, then fold in half.

If you want to have this part ready, at least have the template printed, that would be wonderful!

Other items needed:

- All your regular tangling stuff, being prepared for wherever inspiration may lead!
